Opening of Recreation Areas to Canada Goose Hunting

The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers at Raystown Lake is announcing the opening of the following areas to Canada Goose Hunting: Tatman Run Beach Area, Seven Points Beach Area and the Weaver Falls Recreation Area. Portions of these areas will be closed, except for the purpose of hunting Canada Geese. While the beach areas at Tatman Run and Seven Points are officially closed during this period each year, this release serves as public notice that hunting for the Canada Goose will be permitted. The Canada Goose season lasts from Dec. 8, 2006 through Feb, 15, 2007.

The Corps will provide signs designating all hunting and restricted areas. All other areas around the lake are also open to public hunting during the scheduled waterfowl seasons established by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, provided hunters follow proper safety zone regulations and posted restrictions.

Hunters participating in hunting activities at the Raystown Lake Project must also strictly adhere to all Pennsylvania Game Commission regulations, applicable U.S. Fish and Wildlife regulations, as well as any special regulations posted by the Corps.
