


## Susquehannock Campground Road Improvements for the 2003 Season

The road leading into the Susquehannock Campground has undergone some major improvements. The road, from the Entrance Station through the loop, has been widened, graded and paved. Six culverts have been installed to help drainage. Only 3,200 feet along the single-lane section remain undone. This final section is scheduled to be finished in time to usher in the beginning of the 2003 camping season (barring any unforeseen weather conditions or funding shortcomings).



Although the road will bring smiles to the many return campers, there is a slight bit of hesitance on the part of some to make the area “too welcoming”. “Don’t make it too nice.” one camper remarked, “Then the everyone will come here to camp and we’ll have to share this great campground we’ve tried to keep a secret for so long”.

The gate into Susquehannock remains closed during the off-season. However, it is open during deer hunting season to allow hunter access. Areas that are off-limits to hunting are posted.
